


Autumn Term

We love the new water play. We have negotiated the quickest way to get the ball to the bottom and have had lots of races.











This term, in Pisa class, the children have been learning and practising their number formation.




Using the role play area, the children travelled to space and described what it would be like to be an astronaut.

Liam even tried to build his own space rocket using the pipes in the construction area and Sophia wrote all about an alien.




Spinnaker Class Remember Remember the 5th of Novemberl

After watching a firework video we thought of lots of adjectives to describe what we could see and hear. We wrote our own acrostic poems and did chalk drawings of firework displays.





The children have loved all of the different activities to get us all in the festive mood.








Blackpool Class

describe the fascinating sights, smells and noises they could hear!









In Art, we used a technique called Batik to design and create


pictures. We used wax crayons and water colours to create the effect.


