Sports Premium Funding Expenditure Report: 2017/18

The Government announced its continuing investment in primary sport with the allocation of \pounds 160 million for the 2016/17 financial year to continue to improve physical education and sport in primary schools. In the March 2016 Budget, the Government announced a pledge to double this amount to £320 million from September 2017, funded by taxation on sugar in soft drinks.

Confirmation has now been received which doubles the allocation of the flat cash amount for all primary schools from £8,000 to £16,000 plus £10 per pupil aged 5 and over as at the last Pupil Census. As with previous allocations, this is being paid to schools on a 7/12:5/12 basis over the 2017/18 and 2018/19 financial years.

At Tower Hill, the Sport Premium has historically allowed us to develop a sustainable improvement in teacher confidence and skills, driving the professional development of the teaching team through investing in the services of a specialist sports provider to plan and then work alongside identified teachers across a range of planned disciplines throughout the year.

Whilst our commitment to developing teachers' skills and confidence to deliver high quality P.E. & Sports provision has not altered, now that the level of P.E. & Sports Premium Grant has been confirmed, this is continuing through the sourcing of a Netball specialist to work across Key Stages I & II, who teaches the actual sessions with classes of pupils on a half-term basis whilst teachers observe the strategies, approach, knowledge and skills of that specialist.

Subscription to the local Sports Cluster will continue which allows the P.E. Leader to signpost colleague teachers to specific P.E. & Sport training opportunities facilitated by the local Sports Co-ordinator. Additionally, the new DFE requirement for the teaching of skills involving inversion in gymnastics will be delivered through the local cluster.

We consider swimming a critical life-skill and through pupil conferencing are aware that a significant proportion of our children never - or rarely - visit the local swimming pool despite it being within one mile of the school site and therefore from most of the children's homes until our school funded swimming program takes place in Year 5. To build on this we are continuing to commit the larger proportion of the Sports Premium to additional, intensive swimming programs of three sessions per week for three weeks for all children in Years 2, 3 and 4 - now totalling five classes - aiming to develop confidence in the water at a younger age.
