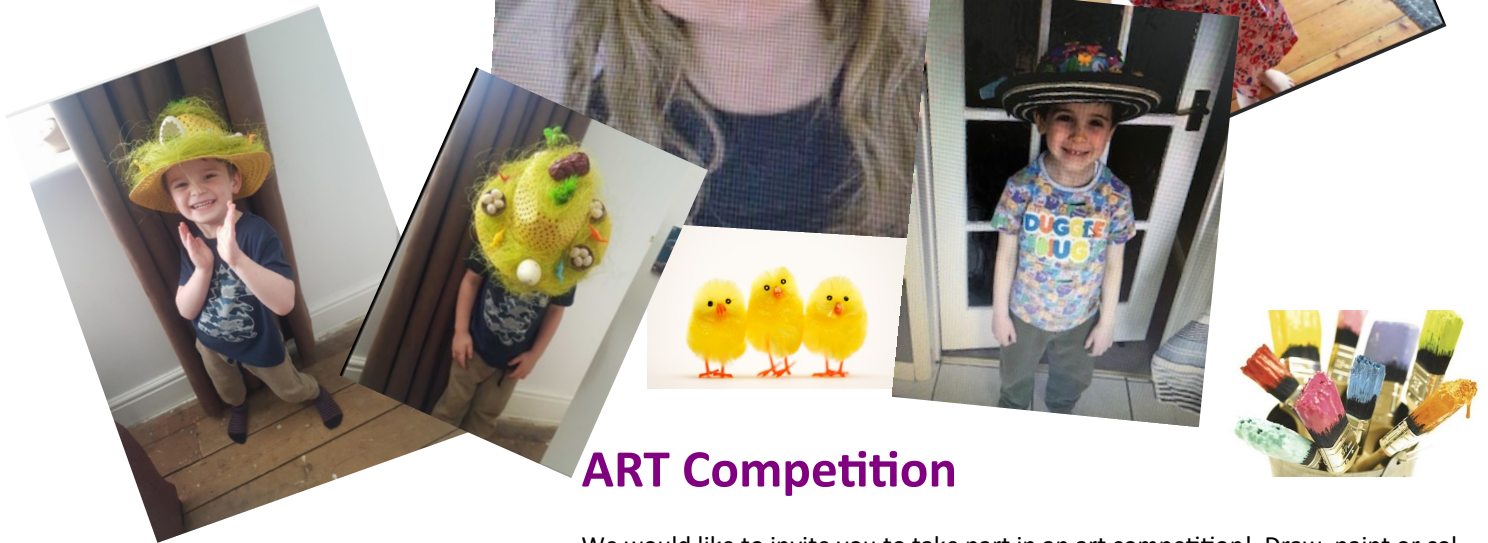
Dear Tower Hill Children,

Coming soon.....On 'Story of the Day'Mrs Tansley!



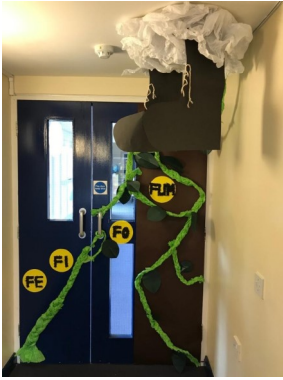
