Week 10 - Topic Support Pack

In this pack, you will find all of the instructions, resources and questions that you will need to complete your Topic lessons for this week. This week we will be carrying on looking at different properties of materials.

Lesson1 – Geography, Charmouth Research

Use the questions below to help you research all about Charmouth.

Where is Charmouth in the UK? How far is it away from
Farnborough?
What is well known for?
What is the coastal area called? What do you think this
means is there?
Is Charmouth a popular place to visit? Why?
Are there any fun facts or information about Charmouth or an area in it?

Lesson 2 - Art, Fossil Drawing

Starter: You will need a sharp pencil. Use the grid below to explore different ways you can shade and practise different pressures with a pencil.

Consider: will this change with different types of pencils? Will it change if you hold the pencil differently?

Activity: Look at the picture of different fossils drawn by Edward Lear (back of pack). Whilst looking through the different fossil drawing, think about what you notice and what textures and shading can you see.

Pick a fossil from the picture to recreate. You can either draw this as accurately as possible, or you can choose to present the fossil very differently. Consider your use of colour, are you going to draw it in black and white or colour?

Whilst you are drawing, stop after a few minutes and think about how you could improve your work. Don't forget to keep looking back at the fossil you are trying to recreate. It's very important to keep referring back to what you are trying to achieve!

Lesson 3 – Art, Design your own dinosaur.

Design, draw and annotate your own dinosaur in the box below.

Consider: what colour is it? Why? How big or small is it? Why? What does it eat? What noise does it make? Where does it live? Etc.

Extension – Which fossil are you drawing?

Research lots of different types of fossils- can you find the name of the one that you chose to draw in Lesson 2?
