Dear Parents,

I am writing regarding **the visit to Bayeux street market**, which is one of the Wednesday activities during our residential trip to France.

The market is located in one narrow street in the centre of the town of Bayeux. We visit the market in order that the children experience a true taste of French culture and have the opportunity to 'have a go at speaking French' (although the vast majority of the stallholders are very used to English speaking customers and do speak English!)

During our time in the market, the children do enjoy being with their friends to look at the goods on sale. **At all times, the accompanying staff remain in the market.** As with most 10 and 11 year olds, the children often prefer to look at the stalls without direct adult supervision. I am writing to request that you indicate your wishes about how your child spends his/her time in the market - bearing in mind that **there will always be a central meeting point where the children know that they can locate at least one of the adults in the party.**

Don't forget, if you wish for your child to be included in the **School Pocket Money System** (which I strongly recommend), you need to send in the amount of **£50.00 (cash or cheque to Tower Hill Primary School - or via on-line payment)** by **Thursday 24th May 2018.**

The **£10 spending money for the return ferry crossing** can be sent in after the half-term by **Tuesday 5th June.**

Finally, please complete the **Text Return Contact Number form** with the mobile number which we should text when we arrive in England on **Friday 15th June 2018** and return it to school also by **Tuesday 5th June 2018 at the latest** so that we can set up our **France 2018 Information System.**
