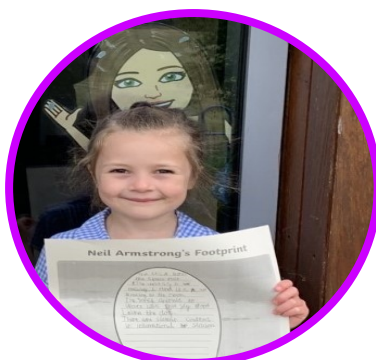
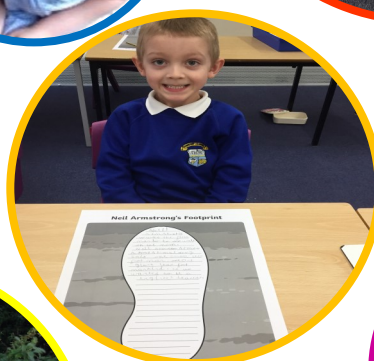


Dear Tower Hill Children,

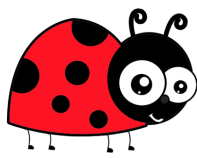

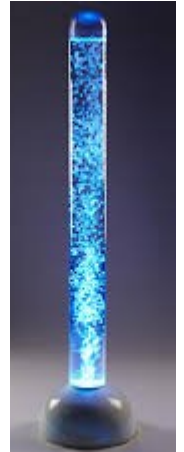
## Exciting news.....



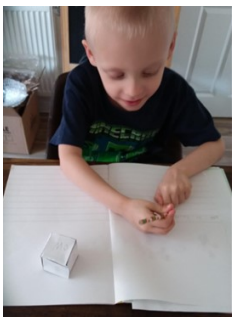
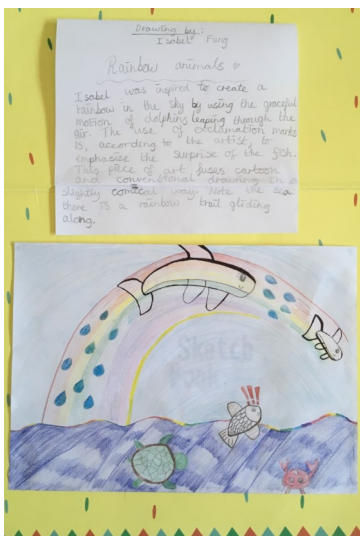
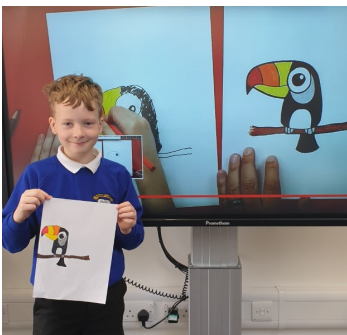
